A Message From The Mayor

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Another summer has come and gone. I hope most of you had an opportunity to join us at our wonderful "Summer Festival". Each year, thanks to Trustee Kick, LG C.A.R.E.S, and the rest of our committee, the event is

always a great success. This year we created a full weekend event by including music on Friday and Saturday leading up to the big day. These special events are generally net zero cost to all of us as taxpayers in the village. Vendors are required to pay to be at the festival and music is provided through our awesome volunteer group, LG C.A.R.E.S, and other donors. Special thanks to all. I hope many of you were also able to come out to our "Family Movie Night". A good time was had by all that attended.

Our village boards and staff have been very busy this year, working on numerous projects to enhance our community.

The speed tables we added on Hawkins Avenue are having the desired effect of slowing down traffic and having commercial traffic rerouting to state roadways to avoid the new speed control. These improvements come at no cost to the taxpayers as the funding for such projects comes from sources only available for traffic control.

The new cell tower located in our DPW yard has been another great addition, as it not only provides better mobile service throughout our village for all of us, but it also provides additional coverage for public safety through the Ronkonkoma Fire Department. Ronkonkoma FD has been experiencing drops in mobile service causing possible delays in responding to the public's needs. We are glad to be able to provide our brave men and women with the best possible tools to protect the community. An additional bonus of housing the tower on municipal property is that it is another source of revenue for the village. As the cost of everything continues to rise, any money coming into our budget helps to keep taxes as low as possible.

With all the great events happening around our village, I hope our new information sign in front of the Village Hall has been a benefit to all. Upcoming events and other valuable information are constantly being updated to keep everyone informed. The cost of the sign has been supplemented by a grant received through the efforts of our staff here at Village Hall. We have also applied for a grant to replace a piece of

playground equipment at Victor Park. These play-sets are typically very expensive. This playground equipment is being provided at no cost to the taxpayers of the village. This park fund is only available to be used towards capital improvements of parkland.

Lastly, we are very excited to be in the process of having our new DPW building installed. The bulk of the funding for the new building has been provided by the federal government through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) stimulus bill. This structure will provide better housing for not only our incredible staff, but also for our valuable equipment. We pride ourselves on sending out the best possible vehicles and equipment to provide the best possible service to all.

As always, thank you all for your continued support and valuable input.

TAX Exemption News for Seniors

Could you be eligible for the Village of Lake Grove's Over 65 limited income property tax exemption? The *maximum* income to qualify for this exemption is \$37,399.99 per household. If you wish to apply for the next year's tax bill over 65 exemptions, please contact us for an application. The income period basis for this particular year is 2022. Applications are available in person or can be mailed to you by calling Jessica in the Tax department 631-585-2000 ext. 108. All completed applications must be received by Friday, December 29, 2023; however, we strongly advise you to submit your application as soon as possible.


Child & Senior ID Event

SAFETY & ENVIRONMENTAL EFFORTS Help Keep our Village Safe and Clean

Please help our Department of Public Works maintain our village to the highest standards. Although it is always important to keep us informed of problem areas, it is imperative during any storm season. Please contact us about any of the following problems or any other maintenance issues now and throughout the year.

- Storm drains blocked or clogged with debris
- Excessive sand on roads and intersections Possible unsafe conditions at any of our parks • Sand or debris on sidewalks • Low tree branches hanging over sidewalks or roads • Damaged or open fences around sumps • Litter

Even though we continue to be enjoying a warm autumn, winter will inevitably be here soon. We urge our residents to follow the village's state of emergency ordinance prohibiting vehicles parking on the road and the removal of basketball hoops during a storm. Working together, we can help ensure that roads and sidewalks are cleared in a safe and efficient manner. Here's how you can help:

- Do not park on the street during snow events Minimize your travel during snow events • Do not throw snow from your walkway or driveway onto the road. Having snow removal teams return to the same street multiple times increases the cost and time necessary to clear the roads.
- Remove snow from your vehicle while it is still parked in your driveway and certainly before you travel.
- Village Code requires that residents and business owners remove snow and ice from the sidewalk within 24 hours of the snow event.

If you don't know the answer to this question, call the Village Fire Marshal. He will provide the information. Lake Grove Village Department of Public Works Guide

APPLIANCES & SCRAP METAL

Appliances & Scrap Metal <u>will not be picked up</u> <u>with regular garbage.</u> Place items at the curb only after contacting Lake Grove Village Hall for a scheduled pick up. Please call 631-585-2000 to schedule a pickup.

These items include: appliances, air conditioners, metal bath tubs, swing sets, water heaters, metal lawn furniture, metal pool frames, auto engines, automobile parts, chain link fences, boats & trailers, metal sheds, and coiled bed springs, along with washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators & freezers with doors removed, and other similar items.

- Major homeowner construction, commercial construction and demolition debris won't be accepted and must be removed by a private firm.
- Lumber must be cut into 4-foot lengths and tied & bundled securely. Nails must be removed or flattened against the wood.
- **Propane tanks** can be brought to any place that sells or services them. No oil tanks or other metal items contaminated with toxic substances will be picked up. Used oil can be taken to the Brookhaven Town Landfill or your local service station.
- Bulk items, such as sofas, coffee tables, TV's, etc. do not require a phone call for special pick up. Residents are allowed to put out no more than 4 bulk items a week on Thursdays or Fridays, depending on where you live in the village. Place at the curb by your garbage pails and the bulk item will be picked up on the 2nd garbage collection of the week.

PAPER BAGGED LEAVES & BRANCHES ONLY

Paper bagged leaves and branches should be placed curbside at the beginning of the scheduled week.

- No bag should exceed 50 pounds
- Branches & Brush- must be bundled and tied in 4' bundles (maximum length)

<u>Please note:</u> Leaves & Brush not bundled appropriately or <u>placed in plastic bags will not be picked up.</u> Each Fall and Spring the Village of Lake Grove provides an allotment of paper leaf bags to each homeowner.

The pick-up schedule for Fall 2023 leaves & brush is as follows:

LEAF BAG & BRANCH CLEAN UP DATES

PAPER LEAF BAGS, BRANCHES & BRUSH (Branches & brush must be tied and bundled & no longer than 4 feet long)

NORTH SIDE PICK-UP

Any street north of Village Hall WEEK OF 10/9, 10/23, 11/6, 11/20 (last week)

SOUTH SIDE PICK-UP

Any street south of Village Hall (including Washburn Street & Moriches Road)

WEEK OF 10/16, 10/30, 11/13, 11/27 (last week)

Leaf bags & tied and bundled brush must be at curb Sunday night prior to pick up week. Will be picked up one day between Monday and Friday. NO GRASS

- ON HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE DAYS, ALL GARBAGE MUST BE PUT CURBSIDE IN COVERED PAILS ONLY.
- GARBAGE SHOULD NEVER BE PUT OUT IN PLASTIC BAGS.
